

The Fourth week of Advent this year is only a day, not even, just a few hours. It is important that we do not lose sight of the meaning of this fourth Sunday. The day before Advent begun, I asked myself: "What is advent for me?" I knew in my heart that if I was clear about what Advent was for me, there was a greater possibility that this season would become more meaningful for me this year. So, I decided to follow the Carmelite traditional Advent themes of Waiting, Accepting, Journeying,

and Birthing to mark my own observance of this season.

On the first week, I focused on waiting. Waiting on God. I have read somewhere that Advent is about letting God come to us. We do the letting and God does the coming. We simply have to open our lives to His coming.

On the second week, I focused on accepting. Accepting that God does not shy from reaching out to us no matter who we are or what situation we might find ourselves in. If God allowed himself to be born in a stable, surely He will not hesitate to come into our hearts no matter how messy and troubled our hearts may be.

On the third week, I focused on the journeying. The Scriptures are full of stories about people on a journey. The Christmas story itself is full of "journeys." We have Mary traveling to visit Elizabeth, and Joseph and Mary traveling from Nazareth to Bethlehem to register for the census; there are the wise men traversing afar to follow the yonder star. Then, even after the birth of Jesus, there was the escape to Egypt in order to avoid Herod's jealous slaughter. There is a saying by the Chinese philosopher, Lao Tzu: "The journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." Indeed, the first step proceeds the second. So, I asked myself, "What is the one small step that I need to make to be in the path to which God is inviting me?"

And now, on this fourth Sunday, Birthing. One afternoon, when I was 10 years old, my mother asked me to accompany her to church for Mass. She was pregnant at that time. For many years, the whole family always wanted a baby girl. My mother even asked the Cloistered Carmelite Nuns to pray with her for this intention. In those days, there was more suspense than it is today with all the medical technology that we have. Nobody knew. The following morning, as we were waking up, my father announced the good news. We had a baby sister! I remember the joy that we all felt that day forty years past. And so today, I ask myself: "How is Christ and his message of love being born in my heart?

A Major Relic of St. Francis Xavier is coming for a visit



A first-degree relic of missionary Saint Francis Xavier is coming to the Archdiocese of Toronto, January 12-14, 2018. The forearm of the saint, permanently displayed at the Church of the Gesù in Rome, will be in Canada from December 29 – February 2, as part of a 14-city Canadian visit. In our archdiocese, the relic will be hosted by St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica (Jan. 12), St. Francis Xavier Church, Mississauga (Jan. 13) and Our Lady

of Lourdes Parish, Toronto (January 14). More information about the visit and a full schedule of events can be found at: <u>www.cco.ca/relic</u>

Organizers believe this is the first time the relic has been on Canadian soil. The body of St. Francis Xavier, which is buried in Goa, India, as well as the relic of his arm, are incorrupt—they have not experienced natural decay since his death in 1552. Organizers expect close to 100,000 people will visit the various events across the country—the same number of people it is believed Francis baptized with his right arm and hand.
