WISH LIST FOR THE NEW CHURCH



Our gratitude goes to all our parishioners and friends who have generously contributed not only to the construction of the new church but also to the various items that are needed, such as, the pews, the crucifix (which is now standing on top of the arches), the Stations of the Cross, the Tabernacle, the sanctuary lamp, the wall mounted consecration candles, the ambo, lectern, altar table, and presidential chair. We have also received donations towards the purchase of the statues of St. Josephine Bakhita, St. Joseph and the child Jesus.

These are some items that we you might want to sponsor in full or partial:

- I) Behind the sanctuary is a small chapel where those who wish to pray closer to the Tabernacle will be able to do so. We would like to see a railing (similar to a communion rail) installed to separate the chapel from the passageway and the door to the Sacristy. The railing costs \$7350.
- In our small chapel, we intend to have 20 stools with kneelers. Three stools have been pledged. We need seventeen more. Each stool costs \$275.
- 3) Also in the sanctuary are specially designed wood planters that will complement the design of the arches. There are six of these planters. Two have been spoken for. We need four more. Each of these planters costs \$1100.
- 4) We will also need two credence table. Each of these credence table costs \$1300
- 5) We will require 750 copies of the Catholic Book of Worship III to enable the community to actively participate in the Mass. Each copy of the Catholic Book of Worship costs \$21.95. Seventy books have been pledged. We need 680 more.
- 6) We got a good deal for the chairs that we will need for the Parish Hall. Each chair costs \$45. We will need about 400 chairs.

Canada Summer Jobs Program - Be Informed & Reach Out to Your MP

The federal government has introduced new requirements for employers applying for the Canada Summer Jobs grant. To be eligible for funding, employers must attest that both the job and the organization's core mandate respect certain "values" as determined by the federal government including the government's position on abortion, sexual orientation and gender identity or expression. Organizations unable or unwilling to make this attestation in whole or in part will be deemed ineligible for the grant. This requirement is clearly unjust. Many Catholic organizations throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto and many other faiths involved in charitable activity at soup kitchens, shelters, refugee welcome centres or summer camps are impacted by this decision.
