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Our New Church



At the end of November of 2007, Pope Benedict XVI offered to the world his second encyclical "Spe Salvi", referencing the Latin text of Romans 8:24, "Spe salvi facti sumus" (In hope we were saved). In the encyclical, the Pope traced the connection between hope and redemption. As Christians, the Holy Father, reminded us, that our lives have a future and it will not end in emptiness. To illustrate his point, he gave the example of Josephine Bakhita, a former slave who came to know Jesus Crucified.

Through her experience of slavery and violence, Bakhita could have come out of that situation with a heart full of bitterness and despair. Her encounter with Jesus Crucified allowed her to integrate the wrong that was inflicted on her, giving it new

meaning, transforming and transfiguring it, and interpreting it as a blessing. "If I were to meet those slave traders who kidnapped me and even those who tortured me, I would get down on my knees to kiss their hands, because if it weren't for them, I wouldn't be a Christian and a religious today."

The parish started celebrating Mass at St. Joan of Arc Catholic Secondary School in the third weekend of July 2008. Not long after, a Building Committee was setup and we started talking about the design of the church together with our architect, Andrew Baczynski of IBI Group of Architects. Six years later, we were able to present our drawings to the Archdiocese Building Committee and to the City of Mississauga for Site Plan Approval and Building Permit. Thanks to the successful Family of Faith Campaign and parish capital campaign, we were given permission to proceed. Mellow-Blamey Construction Inc. was awarded the contract and the work of building commenced in August 2016.

Our church design comprises three octagonal shape buildings that is joined together by a narthex. Pope John Paul II, at the Beatification of Josephine Bakhita, said: "In Blessed Josephine Bakhita, we find an outstanding witness to God's Fatherly love and a bright sign of the enduring value of the Beatitudes. In our time, when the race for power, money and pleasure causes distrust, violence and loneliness, the Lord is giving us Sister Bakhita as the Universal Sister, so the she may reveal to us the secret of the truest happiness: the Beatitudes." There are eight Beatitudes, but why three octagonal shapes, you may asked. In the 1800's, many of the people of Sudan lived in thatched huts and having three of these joined together indicate the shape of a flower. Our patron saint is often referred to as "The African flower". We are fortunate enough to have the City-owned protected woodlot behind the church property, which we also took into account in designing the building. Thus, we do not only have a building with a garden, but a garden with a church. More importantly, as St. Josephine Bakhita herself would teach us, our lives must be marked by unconditional surrender to the will of God, the essence of perfection. Her motto was: "What the Master wishes". As you look at the design, it reminds us of the Transfiguration of Jesus, like a mirror in which the mystery of Christianity is seen in its unity. In this event of Jesus' life, we realize our true calling, that is, to share in the divine life, to find our ultimate end of being united with the Lord, and hope that one day we shall all see God.

A good number of you are asking about Fasting and Abstinence especially as Ash Wednesday happens also to be Valentine's Day. The Church wants emphasis to be given to the evangelical law that a follower of Christ must do penance. While the heart of penance is hatred of sin as an offence against God, external forms of penance are required to deepen and encourage the internal virtue.

Fridays are days of abstinence from meat, but Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day.

The Paschal Fast is observed on Good Friday and, where possible, continued through Holy Saturday.

In the Roman Rite, including in Canada, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and of abstinence from meat.

Privileged forms of Penance are recommended, especially during Lent. These forms are privileged because they are based on the teachings of the Gospels (fasting, almsgiving, prayer, works of mercy) or because of their traditional value among the people of God (abstinence from meat).

Christian fasting obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open to prayer, to share more in the suffering of those who are starving and to save money to give to the poor. Fasting is a penitential discipline intended to open our hearts to God and others, a means of purification and spiritual liberation, a witness of the depth of our faith.

The law of 'abstinence from meat' binds those who are 14 and older; the law of "fasting" binds those from 18 to 59 years of age. Parents and educators are reminded of their duty to introduce children gradually to the understanding and practice of penance. Adult example will be the greatest influence in the matter.
