## Pastor's Desk

The Second Sunday of Lent invites us to reflect on the meaning of the transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor. Tabor is an enabling experience, a moment of reassurance and joy. In his transfiguration Jesus talks with Moses and Elijah. Moses and Elijah were men of vision sent to lead the people of God into freedom. Moses gave the Israelites the courage to leave Egypt and face the difficulties of the desert on their way to the promised land. Elijah, many centuries later, found the Israelites forgetful of themselves and miserable slaves of false gods, his task was to open their eyes to the sorry state they have found themselves in and ready them for that desert journey of the soul that alone leads to the happiness of knowing the one true God.

Moses-like Jesus comes to free us from the slavery to which we are driven by our fear of one another. Elijah-like he comes to free us from the false gods to whom we are in bondage through our fear of ourselves. Perhaps we have no stomach for the journey through the desert that the quest for freedom involves. We are probably like the Israelites who found it more comfortable to submit to the Egyptians than to be liberated or like those in the time of Elijah, who sought solace in the wild rituals of Baal rather than face the silence of the one true God. We have a choice to make during this Lenten season. We can choose what is comfortable and get enslaved in the process or we can choose to listen to Jesus and in that listening await the transfiguration that will support us through the darkness of the cross and carry us forward to resurrection.
