# How well do you know the different parts of our church?

The old Tabernacle was given by Mr. Wilfred Tyrell, who came upon it hidden and forgotten in a pile of old carpets in a warehouse. We had it refurbished thanks to the generosity of many parishioners and friends of the parish.

Since there were no churches during those early centuries, Christians did not have a tabernacle. However, as we do today, they were very careful to protect the Blessed Sacrament. When churches began to be constructed in the fourth century, the sacred species were kept in various rooms, including an area that became known as the sacristy. The design of the tabernacle slowly evolved, and by the 16<sup>th</sup> century tabernacles similar to those we have today were in use. Church Law spells out the rules for the Tabernacle's location: "The tabernacle is in which the Blessed Eucharist is reserved should be sited in a distinguished place in the church or oratory, a place which is conspicuous, suitably adorned and conducive to prayer" (no. 938.2)

In every Catholic church we find a readily visible lamp or candle burning before the Tabernacle. This is called the Sanctuary lamp. It recalls for us the story of the Wise Men who followed the star until they found the baby Jesus in a stable. The ever-present sanctuary light still beckons to each one of us. The flame signifies the Lord's presence among us.
