How well do you know the different parts of our church?

Since it is Easter, the most prominent symbol that you will find in every Catholic Church is the paschal candle that is standing by the ambo to represent the light of Christ. The Paschal candle originated in the fourth century and every year in all Catholic churches throughout the world a new candle is blessed at the Easter Vigil. The decoration in the candle differs, but certain elements are always present: There is a cross with five nails (representing the five major wounds of Jesus), the Greek letters Alpha and Omega (declaration that Jesus is the beginning and the end), and the year. After the Easter season, the paschal candle is moved near the baptismal font. Whenever baptisms are celebrated, the paschal candle is lit and the flame, the light of Christ, is transferred to a smaller candle that is given to the baptized child or adult. It is also placed near the casket during a funeral liturgy to signify the dignity of the baptized person whose funeral it is and the hope we all have in Christ that life is changed, but not ended.

Pastor's Desk

A young person requested if I could write a letter to his boss so he can be excused from working on Sunday, which I gladly obliged. It is wonderful to see that in a young person and a company willing to accommodate the needs of their employees.

It is a commandment from God since the beginning of time that people should rest one day of the week. In the Old Testament, it was a Saturday, for it is the day that creation was completed. For Christians, it is Sunday, the day of Christ's resurrection. It is simple to say to just avoid working on Sundays, but most people have to work whenever the boss tell them to work, or else they would have no job at all. All need to make a living and that might mean working on Sundays. The Church, who knows and understands people's needs does not condemn people who work on Sundays.

Perhaps, it might be helpful to suggest that each one should assess his or her situation to determine if it is necessary to work on Sunday. If our job demands working on Sundays, it would be better to find another job. If we can't, we don't sin. But we shouldn't work Sundays just to earn more if we are doing fine, to grow a business that is already doing fine, or to take advantage of people's situation or competitor's. It is true that we want to make more, not always for greed, but more for a concern, for example, of future needs; to get what we would be needing anyway, but faster; to protect ourselves or our business; to have a saving as a financial cushion for ourselves or our family members; to have an emergency fund; to pay debts or mortgages...actually, all these reasons are legitimate, but they can be accomplished without working on Sundays. In other words, the need of working on Sundays must be a basic need to make a living; otherwise, there is simply no need. Besides all these, we need to attend Mass, give thanks and pray more, spend time with our families, and enjoy the fruits of our labour.
