Pastor's Desk

Keeping Silence...at different times during the Liturgy. We are silent before the Liturgy begins, in order to be present to each other and thus find God. God is always present to us; we forget this sometimes and fail to hear God amid our noisy living. So before we start the Mass, we are silent: Be still, and know that I am God.

We keep a brief silence after the invitation "Let us pray..." At this invitation, we pray and we do so together, so that when the presider speaks, all of our prayers are drawn to those words like metal shavings to a magnet.

We are silent after the readings, so we can truly hear the divine voice that is not only echoing from long ago, but speaking to us now, in this time, and in this place. By being silent, we listen to the voice on which our lives depend, the voice that calls us into being, the voice that bids us to come out from our tombs like Lazarus did in order that we may live and love.

Sometimes, we find it hard to practice silence. We need to work on it. Our silence, at first, may seem awkward. Throat will cough, seats will creak, the pages of the hymn book will rattle. But if we stick to it, eventually our silence will deepen and lengthen. We will come to appreciate the chance to contemplate together, and the liturgy will become an encounter with God that has a rhythm of song and speech and silence, of action and rest.

Wish List for the Church

These items can be sponsored by one individual or group of individuals. Donation can be given in full or by installment.

- We are looking for someone to sponsor the camera that we installed inside the church. The camera will allow us to broadcast the Mass into the Parish Hall in the event of an overflow, like Christmas and Easter. It will also allow us to broadcast our celebrations on the internet, and it will also serve as part of our security system.
- Two monitors that will be installed inside the church, so we can follow the hymns and the prayers that may not be in our hymn books.
- Projector in the Parish Hall and motorized screen
- Banquet and serving Tables for the Parish Hall
- The Catholic Book of Worship that you have in the pews are not fully paid. About 271 books have been spoken for. There are still 229 books that need to be sponsored. If you wish to sponsor a copy or several copies, the cost is \$22 per copy.
- We got a good deal for the chairs that we need for the Parish Hall, Each chair costs \$45. About 79 chairs have been donated. We are still looking for 221 chairs to be sponsored.
- I am exploring the possibility of one day installing a digital Carillon Bell System that can play 10,000 + hymns and should the parish decide in the future to have actual bells it too can be added into the system. The digital system is estimated to cost US\$20,000 +/-. We have already an initial donation of S2731.20
- We have two niches on the façade of the church that need a marble statue a statue of the Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart. Each marble statue is estimated \$15,000. To date, we have received a donation of \$560.
