

# MaryGrove Camp

Marygrove Camp is a residential camp situated on Georgian Bay, near Penetang, Ontario. Open to eligible girls ages 5 - 13, Marygrove provides an 8 day camping experience for children who may not otherwise have the opportunity to enjoy a camping adventure. Families who are experiencing financial or domestic hardship may contact the Society to determine their eligibility.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Toronto Central Council, helps over 1,000 girls each summer, registering eligible campers through home visits. Each camper's holiday is fully subsidized through the generous support of an annual CampCollection held in the parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto.

# Living the Gospel by helping isolated seniors

In partnership with Catholic Family Service agencies and six parishes in Peel Region and Simcoe County, ShareLife is funding a pilot project that connects trained volunteers with isolated and lonely seniors. Volunteers cultivate relationships by conducting home visits, making phone calls, and linking seniors with community resources. Through your generosity, ShareLife is connecting these seniors with the support they need.

# Pastor's Desk

We are all familiar with the saying that "the unexamined life is not worth living." Therefore, before one retires for the night, it is always beneficial to sit quietly and review how one's day unfolded. This practice is called "Examen".

The following outline is based on St. Ignatius's presentation of the Examen in the Spiritual Exercises.

- The first one does is to become aware of the love with which God looks upon me as I begin this exercise.
- I note the gifts that God's love has given me this day, and I give thanks to God for them.
- I ask God for an insight and a strength that will make this process a work of grace, fruitful beyond my human capacity to accomplish it.
- I review the day. I look for the stirrings in my heart and the thoughts that God has given me. I look also for those times during the day that have not been of God. I review my responses to both, and throughout the day in general.
- Where there is brokenness, I ask God for forgiveness and healing.
- I, then, look to the following day and, with God, plan concretely how to live it in accord with His loving desire for my life.
- Aware of His presence, I prayerfully conclude the activity.

I share to you this method because it is not only a good method, but a method that has helped a lot of people grow in their relationship with God and with others. Growth in relationship with God and with others occurs with through mutual self-revelation, that is, God uncovers Himself to us and we too Him.

# Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and Children

Our parish offers the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and Children (RCIA and RCIC) to those who wish to explore the possibility of becoming Catholics through the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. We encourage all parishioners to take an active interest in this noble work of evangelization as members of the Team or sponsors to the candidates and catechumens. The RCIA and the RCIC usually commence in September to Easter, but the ministry of evangelization continues all year round.

We have more than enough Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers in our parish. We ask our parishioners to consider volunteering as Ministers of Hospitality, Beads and Things, Ministers of consolation, Ministry to Mothers, Ministry to Maturing Adults, Youth Ministry, Ministry of Evangelization to name a few of other ways of serving God in the community.
