While we love the image of the Good Shepherd, most of us lack firsthand acquaintance with either a shepherd or with sheep. So let's look at a comparison, one that is much more familiar to us. While we are not likely to be greeted by a flock of sheep when we open the oor, many of us have been greeted by - a dog!

Anyone who has ever shared a home with a

dog for a long time will see the parallel immediately. For in this case, you are the good shepherd, the one who cares for another totally. Just as we are completely dependent on God for everything, so, too, your dog is totally dependent on you. A relationship is established that is truly unique. The bond is impossible to describe, but also impossible to deny. In fact, if you want to find out just important you are, try calling someone else's dog! It is a real egodeflator.

Magnify that many times over and listen again to the opening words of today's gospel: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." What greater blessing could there be than this: The shepherd knows my voice and I know his. There is instantaneous, constant communication as we seek to become one with this Good Shepherd. The closer, the more intimate that relationship, the better will we comprehend the words of our Shepherd: "no one can take them out of my hand."

On Stewarship

As we seek to enter into the experience of stewardship, it is essential that we avoid being short-circuited by emphasis upon its most obvious but superficial aspect, the sharing of material goods. If we start with that, with the fund-raising for apostolic purposes, we will go no further, and stewardship will become just another program. No, we can only be satisfied with deep stewardship, which means a profound inner conversion as individuals and as a community in which we become committed to living generously in every way, as the Gospel calls us to do. Deep stewardship begins with gratitude and ends with accountability. Stewardship is sometimes called "the attitude of gratitude." We recognize gratefully that everything in life is a gift of God. We do not ultimately own anything, but are entrusted with time, talent, and treasure for use during our brief passage through this life. And at the end of life, we take nothing with us, except the life which arises out of generous love. If each of us is profoundly aware that all is gift, then we are freed from possessiveness, and can be good stewards of what has been entrusted to us in life, sharing generously and so at the end of life returning all to the Lord with increase. Like the servants in the parable, we will be called to account for the way in which we have used what has been entrusted to us.
