We don't often associate Jesus with hate, and when we do see Christians who seem to hate, we immediately talk about how un-Christian that concept is. But, here it is in black and white. Jesus explains to those at the table what it would mean to follow him, to follow his way to the Kingdom of God.

To follow Jesus, we have to give up a system of dependence and security. Jesus has told us many times through the Gospels that we must not be dependent on anything but God. Remember the lilies of the field that Jesus talked about. Again, think about the word "hate" not as passionately disliking family, but instead as preferring reliance on God over reliance on family. God will provide, Jesus is saying, if you follow my path.

# The Environment: Caring for our common home

Voting for a candidate who wants to build on our commitment as a country to protect our environment today and for future generations is one way we can care for God's creation.

When it comes to the environment, Pope Francis calls us to have a personal change of heart and a collective transformation that responds to "both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." In his encyclical Laudato Si', On Care for Our Common Home, he issues an urgent challenge to all of us "to protect our common home ... to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change." While Earth is our common home, we continue to act in a way that damages our relationship with it by harming the environment. This also damages our relationship with those around us, especially the most vulnerable in our society. To bring about positive change, individuals, families and communities can make a difference in small yet significant ways. This includes making sustainable choices, reducing waste and changing our lifestyle when needed. In this way we take steps towards a deeper spiritual ecological conversion.
