In the ancient world, a person who owned slaves or servants designated their allotted tasks; some labored in the fields whereas others were assigned to domestic duties. In Jesus' parable, the featured servant was doing double duty. However, even with this heavy burden, he was doing

no more than was expected of him as a servant. Therefore, he should have expected any reward or even an expression of gratitude from his master.

Although tough and challenging, Jesus' point is clear; those who accept God's gift of faith and the relationship that grows from it are to consider themselves servants, no more, no less. The real issue in this Sunday's parable is not how the boss treats the servants but how the servant understands his role. This story reminds each of us of our servanthood and how tempting it is to opt for a reversal of roles. God is God and Master; we are creatures and servants. Faith, however, affords us the insight to understand who we are, viz., servants in the manner of Jesus, who did not cling to his godly status but assumed the role of the servant who, suffered, washed the feet of his own, and ministered to sinners. By his own admission, Jesus identified with the role of servant rather than master; "I am among you as the one who serves" (Lk. 22:27). In this, he set an example of service for his followers.

POVERTY INCOME INSECURITY, FOOD INSECURITY AND HOMELESSNESS

Canada's poverty level has been declining in recent years but remains high in many communities across the country. In 2017, 3.4 million Canadians (9.5%) lived below the poverty line (down from 10.6% in 2016). That includes 622,000 children (9%) under the age of 18. The Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) reports that the poverty rate for the working-age population in Canada is well above the average for the world's wealthiest industrialized countries. The human cost of poverty is staggering: broken families, children underachieving or failing in school, chronic homelessness, health problems and more.

"Governments must protect those who are marginalized in society ... must provide economic security and an acceptable quality of life for those who are unemployed, displaced, impoverished or afflicted by a mental or physical disability ... Voluntary efforts, though still needed, cannot begin to cope with the problems of the marginalized. Only government can do this adequately. The gospel clearly indicates that our final option must always be for the poor." —Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario, "On Choosing a Government," 1998
