But it is not by accident that Jesus chose a poor widow and a corrupt judge to illustrate his message. Jesus was alert to the glaring disparities of his time. A pattern emerges in his stories that is far more challenging than just a lesson about persistent prayer. At the heart of Jesus is a regard for the poor and the weak. Jesus' challenge to anyone is to see the world through his eyes. If we adopt this way of seeing, who are the powerful and privileged, and who are the weakest and most vulnerable people in every situation? We do not have to search far to identify the widows and orphans, the powerless, the victims of power, and the disenfranchised. What burden does it place upon us to then take the next step and acknowledge that Jesus is among them?

If we apply this to our immediate circumstances, the question becomes: who in our faith community is the least among us, the most vulnerable, the neediest or even, the most difficult to respond to? How well have we, as a parish, responded to the needs of our teens, the physically and mentally impaired, the invisible and neglected groups who have not been sought out and welcomed?

The parable does teach us to persevere in prayer. But once we know just what we are praying for, then we will know why we need to persevere.
