

Overcoming Obstacles

Our image of Zacchaeus is a short, pudgy, excitable man shinnying up a tree eager to see Jesus and we like him. But his fellow townmates considered him a sinner and not very well liked. Zacchaeus was an opportunistic at best, a chiseler at worst. When the Romans occupied his country, he saw a way to make friends with them and also make a profit. He gathered taxes from his neighbours and since tax collectors worked on commission, it was common for them to collect more than was owed. Zacchaeus was looked down because of that. But Jesus invited himself at his house: "Zacchaeus, come down, I mean to stay at your house today." Then, after Zaccheaus opens his home and his heart to Jesus and allows that gracecharged encounter to transform his life by overcoming the obstacles that stood between him and his redeemer, Jesus affirs, "Today salvation has come to this house" (v. 10).

Spending time with Jesus has had the desired, profound effect upon Zacchaeus as is shown in the promises he has made to the Lord. In his pledge to give half his property to the poor, Zaccheaus showed that he had not only welcomed Jesus in to his home but that he had also made his

own the heart and mind and concerns of God.

Determined not to allow any obstacle to separate him from salvation, Zacchaeus amplified his response to God's gift of grace by offering to make retribution to all whom he had wronged. The Old Testament Law stipulates that if a person voluntarily admitted that he had defrauded anyone, that person was required to repay the amount defrauded plus 20% more. What Zacchaeus offered, however, was the maximum. Zacchaeus believed in the saving presence and power of God.

There is such thing as cheap grace and costly grace. Cheap grace preaches forgiveness without requiring repentance, communion without confession, and discipleship without the cross. Costly grace is the call of Jesus at which the disciple leaves all to follow him. Costly grace confronts each of us as it did Zaccheaeus with a challenge.

What do you think is the obstacle that stands between you and God. Zacchaeus was courageous in opening his heart to Christ. How about you?


