Seonday Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah was first addressed to a people who have suffered exile, but it can also speak to us today. We may not be in exile literally, but more often than not, we have been exiled from God due to our own making. We sometimes wonder where God is and there is a great temptation to give up on God. The good news is that God had not given up on His people. Neither does God with us. Even in our unfaithfulness, God does not cease to be concerned about us. He is always drawing us to Himself - showing us the way back to Him.

God has great plans for us. It is for this reason that He gave us His only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus is the Chosen One, sent by the Father, to shed light into our darkness. In Jesus, we are called to reflect that light, so that in every place, in every aspect of our lives, and in every relationship that we have, God's love may be felt.

Last Sunday, we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan by John. The moment that Jesus emerged from the water, John saw the heaven opened like a curtain that is torn in two and the Holy Spirit dropped on Jesus and the voice of the Father was heard, declaring this same Jesus as His Beloved Son. This gave rise to John exclaiming: "Look, there is the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world." And again, "Yes, I have seen and I am the witness that He is the Chosen One of God."

At the moment of our own baptism into Christ, we, too, have become children of God. We, too, have received the gift of the Holy Spirit. We share in that wonderful privilege.

As we can see later on, the Baptism of Jesus marked for him the start of his public ministry. Like Jesus, as the baptized, we, too, are called to ministry. There is so much need around us. We need to recognize those needs so that we can appropriately respond to the best of our ability.

Certainly, we need to look at this not only as individuals, but also as a parish community. Reflecting on God's Word and in quiet prayer, in what way as a parish community are we called to serve?

The Devotion to the Infant Jesus

Special devotion to the Divine Child is present in many parts of the world. The famous of this devotion is that of the Infant Jesus of Prague. Princess Polyxenia of Lobkowitz had received as a wedding gift from her mother the statue of Jesus dressed in royal robes and wearking a king's crown, which was previously brought from Spainl In 1628, the princess entrusted the statue to the Carmelite Friars, but soon after trouble came into the city and the Fathers had to flee and were unable to take with them the statue. The invaders seized it and threw it into a pile of rubbish. In 1635, the Carmelites returned to the city and found the statue amidst the rubbish. One of the Friars, Fr. Cyril, heard a voice that spoke to him: "Have mercy on me and I will have mercy on you. Give me hands and I will give you peace. The more you honour me, the more I will bless you." When Fr. Cyril unwrapped the statue, he noticed that both hands of the statue were broken off. The statue was restored and copies of the statue have circulated throughout the world.

When Spaniards came to the Philippines in 1521, they brought a statue of the Infant Jesus with them. Upon the baptism of the first natives, Ferdinand Magellan gave the statue as a gift. The Filipino people have treasured this gift for 500 years. Many saints, like St. Therese of the Little Flower, had a great devotion to the Infant Jesus. May we too receive many blessings through this devotion to God's Infant Son.



FAQ's Regarding Baptism

May a Catholic serve as a godparent at a non-Catholic baptism?

A Catholic may act as witness at a non-Catholic baptism, but not as a sponsor. The only situation in which a Catholic may be a godparent (sponsor) in "another ecclesial Community" is in an Eastern Orthodox Church "if he/she is so invited" (Directory for the Application of the Principles and Norms of Ecumenism, 98, a, b).

In the future, may I change the Baptismal sponsors?

On occasion, one or both of the people who served as godparents are no longer a part of the child's life or they have moved a great distance and the possibility of an ongoing relationship is compromised. In this type of a situation, parents may wish to change the Baptismal record and add the name of a new godparent. Although a new person may now hold a place of prominence in the faith life of the child it is not possible to alter the Baptismal register. The register is a legal record and the original godparents were a witness to the event. It would be untruthful to remove the name of the original witness and replace it with a new name, perhaps someone who was not even present at the Baptism.


