It is the God-given prerogative of every person to change his/her mind. A change of mind is also a change of heart and a change of heart can transform life.

In the first reading, the prophet Ezekiel informs his readers that a changed mind will result in significant consequences. Those who change their minds, their hearts and their lives by turning toward what is good will reap the benefits therof. Conversely, those who change their mind, their hearts and their lives by turning from goodness to evil will reap retribution.

In the parable of the two sons and their father, each son is afforded the same opportunity. One said yes at the beginning and did not follow it up at the end. The second said no, but did change his mind and did what his father requested him to do. Because of his willingness to change his mind, he is held to us an example to be emulated..

St. Paul refers to this turning, choosing, and changing as the process of conversion or as he puts it: "putting the mind of Christ."

Change is never easy, but change we must in order to become more like Christ each day.
