# UNLESS YOU HAVE FAITH

If read without faith, today's gospel is a treacherous passage. Read it. Feel the effect of forgiving everyone, even your enemies, of giving more than you are asked, refraining from condemning, pardoning everyone. It is no wonder that Christians are considered wimps. If you know someone like that, you know full well you have here a sheep for the shearing.

Jesus' position is morally clear. We "owe" forgiveness because we have been fortiven. And furthermore, it is not your job to make it all better. You and I cannot heal your daughter, or the wounds of a mother who has lost a child, a person who has lost a reputation, an innocent person who has lost five years of life behind bars.

But Jesus' radical position is that God is our vengeance. We trust that God will restore justice at some time in some way.

If we don't trust that God will deal justly with us and those who offend us, then forgiveness is nonsence. But forgiveness is the greatest act of faith we can make. It is leaving the establishment of justice up to God. We acknowledge our limitations. We are human. We don't get to play God.

If we have faith, then we don't have to think ourselves so noble either. It isn't that I don't want the other person to suffer. I rather think I'd relish a little richlydeserved pain. The reality, if I believe, is that I don't feel the need to administer that pain. God will administer just the right amount of pain - enough to make the jerk repent, or, if the person doesn't repent, then the lesson will have to be learned in another way.

Forgiveness is an act of faith. We let God take care of my enemy and me. And I trust that God will take care of both of us better than I could.

## ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN THE HOSPITAL

Please connect with the Spiritual Care Department of the hospital if you or your loved one needed a priest to administer the sacrament. Given the current restrictions, many hospitals are not yet allowing the priest chaplains to make non-urgent visits using the list of registered Catholic patients. If a patient desires to see a priest, please speak to the patient's nurse to make a request.

All hospitals have their own restrictions and their own means of functioning. Some hospitals (as a whole) are only allowing access for sacrament of the sick (sometimes end of life only). Other hospitals allow access for urgent and nonurgent requests. There are even some hospitals where access is decided by each unit individually; as a result, some units require the approval of the unit manager for the priest chaplain to attend while others allow the priest chaplains to access the unit without restriction. Please be patient in navigating through these diverse restrictions.

Please do not wait until the last moment. There are instances when there is much more that is needed to spiritually support the patient.
