# FINDING GOD

We need to change our perspective because God loves us even before we even begin to love Him. We are created by Him and we are destined for Him. Here are a few suggestions to help you during this season of grace:

1) Change your thinking about yourself and about God. I suggest that you start believing that God loves you. You may think you are the worst sinner that has ever been born into this world. Guess what? Jesus says that even just one person who connects with God will make heaven burst out in great celebration. Why? because God does not give up on any one us. He loves us so much. He can't turn away His face away from us when we turn to Him.

2) God is always reaching out to you all the time. When your heart is stirred to talk to Him or even to do good, to smile, to offer a kind word to someone, it is God who is prompting you. Do not let your fear, your ego, your position, or your anxiety get the better of you. Be open, willing to receive the new seeds that God wants to plant into your life. Your life is a fertile soil. These seeds can take root, sprout and grow.

3) The reason we often fail to find God is because we are looking for Him everywhere when in fact He is already in you. Keep that thought always and remember God also dwells in others too.

# Discover the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the Season of Lent

By this beautiful Sacrament God gives all sinful members of His Church, "a direct, human, and personal encounter with the mercy of God" as found in the Gospel. [1] (CCC: 1446) In this encounter "God, the Father of mercies" pardons His faithful for post-baptism sins that they confessed to the bishop or his priests. (CCC: 1448-1449). In the liturgical actions of this sacrament, especially in the formula of absolution, Jesus Christ reaches out to us in the depth of our soul and mind to lift us to our feet, and restores us to be more perfectly what we are: His saints, the reconciled children of God. He does so "to set us free from the hands of our enemies, free to worship Him without fear, holy and righteous in His sight all the days of our life" (Luke 1.73).[2]

The essential elements of the sacrament of Reconciliation are two: the acts of the penitent who comes to repentance through the action of the Holy Spirit, and the absolution of the priest who in the name of Christ grants forgiveness and determines the ways of making satisfaction.
