UNBEKNOWN TO MANY OF YOU

For almost ten (10) years, we operated St. Peter's Mission Church on the Ninth Line. We returned the small church to the Hamilton Diocese, which in turn handed it to the Oblates of Mary Immaculate for their Global Missionary Outreach. I would have wanted the small church as an extension of the parish, but it was not granted. Man proposes and God disposes. We are consoled in our grief by the gift of the old statue of the Sacred Heart (120 years old) and is now standing next to my pastor's office.

The Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is popular to us all...and the month of June is dedicated to the devotion. Even our Archbishop, Thomas Cardinal Collins, have written a pastoral centre, inviting us to discover anew this wonderful devotion. We live in a time when the Eucharist has become a battle ground for so many things - from the way we ought to celebrate the Mass to who should be able to receive Holy Communion. When our Lord appeared to Margaret Mary Alacoque, He opened and offered his heart enflamed with His great love. He was offering his friendship to her and also to us. "I no longer call you servants, but friends," Jesus tells us in the gospel. This should be where we ought to start. By giving us his heart, he is offering us his friendship. When we come for Holy Mass, this is where that offer friendship is reitterated again and again... The question that we should ask is not whether we are worthy or not worthy rather, whether we accept his offer of friendship or not. This is our starting point. When we recognize his offer of friendship and welcomes it, then our prayer and participation in the Eucharist will be colored by it. Our prayer and participation in the Mass will be like a heart to heart communication between two friends. Jesus is offering His heart to you and me. By giving your heart to Him and accepting his heart in exchange, you will also be enflamed with the same charity - the same love and concern for the needs of the whole world.

When I was a young seminarian, I once asked a holy priest, what the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary really means. I was expecting him to advice me to say that and this prayer...instead he said, drawing me closer to him, as if he was disclosing to me a venerable secret. He said: "Mark, the beating of the heart of Jesus and that of His Blessed Mother are in sync. Place your heart between their hearts so that the beating of your own heart will sync with theirs." I have always treasured those words of that holy priest. When we were designing our church, I insisted to have two niches infront - one for the Sacred Heart and another for the Immaculate Heart, so that anyone who enters our church will always pass thru the hearts of Jesus and Mary.

I see so many people come to pray before the statues during the day and even in the night... I always see flowers being offered. People who do not come inside the church for some reason, but would just be contented to stay outside, like the Publican in the Gospels, that felt so unworthy and hitting his breast: "have mercy on me a sinner" - but know and be reassured that Jesus is offering and continues to offer His heart to you and me... will you accept His heart and will you offer your heart to Him too?

I give to you my heart and my liberty... let's whisper that to Him today.

SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION

On March 13, 2020, Cardinal Collins issued a communication to the faithful of this archdiocese indicating that it was necessary to cancel public celebrations of the Eucharist on the coming Sunday, stating: "For this weekend and any other which may be required, I grant the faithful dispensation from their Sunday obligation."

Given that most of the health and safety restrictions in our parishes are no longer in place and the faithful are able to attend the celebration of the Eucharist once again, the basis for the dispensation from the Sunday obligation has dissipated and is no longer in effect.

The Church does not obligate people to do the impossible. If individuals, based on their conscience, cannot attend Mass for a grave reason, including a great vulnerability to COVID-19 or because they are self-isolating to limit the spread of illness, then they are excused from their Sunday obligation, as the law of the Church allows.

After two years of COVID-19 restrictions, many have been deprived of the opportunity to attend Mass and to receive the most Holy Eucharist and all of us have missed the opportunity to experience community, including members of our parishes. WE invite and encourage EVERYONE to return to the practice of attending Mass inperson.
