The month of November is a month we remember all our loved ones who have died. It is also a month dedicated to reflecting on death and the various things associated with dying. Catholics, we hold on to the promise that life does not end with death. We express this belief so beautifully and assuringly at the Funeral Liturgy. Life is changed, not ended. We are a people of hope - to die is gain because we will be with Christ, the angels, the saints, and all our loved ones. In the meantime, as we journey through this life, we live the humanity of Jesus, who was born poor, lived poor, and died poor. Whatever experiences in life we may have, Jesus experienced it too in his lifetime. We can be assured that we have a friend in Him who understands and cares about us. Just as we share in the death of Adam, we also share in the life of Christ who rose from the dead.

Perhaps, we can ask the question: "When we die, is that all? Are we as dead as seem, or are we still somehow alive? If we are not going to resurrect we might as well get all we can out of this world - even if it means hurting and trampling other people. But if we do resurrect, we need to think about it more and how we should go about it. There is a temptation to ignore this valley of tears for the next, better one. But is it the way of Jesus? No, Jesus wants us to know that God is a God of the living. He came to give us overflowing, abundant life. And our task is to live it to the full - and then everything else will be given to us besides.

We cannot afford to be oblivious to the needs and challenges around us. We need to hand on our faith and our values. We have hope and we should want all people to have this hope.
