We understand that there is not a lot of money floating around and we have to be contented with whatever we may have. However, our parish collection is not enough. We had more expenses than what we received. The big chunk of our monthly expense is \$18,000 to service our mortgage.

If we are able to raise \$18,000 monthly, I think we should be ok. Although, I must say that there are always surprises, such as, for example, the fire extinguishers have to be replaced and emerging batteries too! Can our child be baptized if we're not married?

Not married in the Church? Your child's Baptism and your marriage are two separate issues. Your marital status may be discussed during your Baptism interview to encourage you to get married (or validate your marriage in the Church) if this is appropriate. Does our child have to be baptized in order to attend a Catholic school?

It is important to check with the school board that has jurisdiction where your child will attend school. The trustees of each board interpret the admission requirements in their own way. Some school boards require proof of a parent's Catholic Baptism, especially if the child has not been baptized. This establishes their eligibility to direct their taxes to the Catholic board. This is a government, not a Church stipulation. If the child is not baptized, the parents are usually encouraged to meet with the Pastor of their parish (or his delegate) to discuss this issue.

Baptism is never to be seen as a means to enroll in a Catholic school.

Do you know that we are now fifteen (15) years as a parish community. Our parish was created on paper in February of 2008 by Thomas Cardinal Collins, D.D. carving part of Merciful Redeemer Parish and St. John of the Cross. With the creation of the parish, Fr. Mark was able to prepare the groundwork by securing a house to serve as Office and Rectory and also a place to gather for Worship. By the month of May, Deacon Barry was ordained and appointed to serve as our first deacon. We were also given Sr. Cristina of the Canossian Daughters of Charity to assist us. Various choirs came and by the second week of July we were ready to begin our Sunday Masses After a few weeks, we were able to re- open St. Peter's Church. Sadly, we were not able to secure it for the parish after almost ten (10 years) of using and maintaing the historic church, but it will also be part of our parish memory and our identity as a parish community. For ten (10) years, we gathered at St. Joan of Arc School until we were able to have this church as our permanent home. We have much to be grateful for!
