Both liturgically and in our contemporary culture, we are given mixed signals about the pay attention to and spend time on. While it is still December 10, Christmas has been here quite a while already. As early as September 1 in some places. Our present day culture gives us a clear message - shop, buy, and party. I know of some people who have gone all out to decorate their homes to create a "perfect" Christmas.

Our readings today reminds us that there are things money cannot buy. While the most part this season is festive, for some it is rather difficult and hard - loneliness, poverty, dysfunctional in our relationships, war and violence.

The prophet Isaiah is like the one who speaks of a perfect Christmas - he pictures for us an idyllic time on the horizon when God will restore all that Israel has lost, that all her sins will be forgiven, her debts paid, and she can have peace. But the Gospel reminds us of the person of John the Baptist. We see that the promise of wonderful things to come, while true and trustworthy, brings with it both responsibilities and duties. Our deepest needs and God's promises will be satisfied and fulfilled to the extent that we acknowledge and rid ourselves of our simful actions and attitudes. This is something we would prefer to be reminded about during Lent, but not in Advent! Hence the paradox. In advent, we are called both to be hopeful, joyful revelers while at the same time engaging in the hard work of repentance.

Take the time at least a few minutes each day to sit quietly in prayer. Come to our church, the Lord is here and waiting for you. 10 December 2023
