Today's gospel tells a story about an outsider, who, as John tells Jesus, "was not following us." The outsider was not interfering with the disciples' work, that he had a different purpose, or that he opposed them. Just simply because the guy "was not following us", that seems to be their stumbling block.

How do we make sense of this story in our time? One possible area that we can look at is the effects of immigration and our experience of multiculturalism. We probably don't want to admit it, but there are times when we have a hard time dealing with people who does not look or dress like us, does not speak or act like us, think or believe like us. We probably do not want to admit readily that we are threatened, that these people seem to have a better advantange, that they are depriving us of our jobs, that our towns and cities are no longer the same, and so on...

We often like to draw the line, but Jesus takes a different approach. He erase the line and enlarges the circle. Jesus is once again asking us to look at ourselves, to be self-reflective. The problem is not with the other. it is with us - our biases, our prejudices, our pride, our selfishness, our anger and revenge, our unwillingness to listen, that our way is the right way or our need for power and control.

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WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES

God does not watch from a distance. but enters into our human condition, our human suffering, and in turn invites us to enter into His love and the communion of the Holy Trinity. On this mystery of the Incarnation and a shareing in the divine life offered to us, Pope Francis reminds us, "God not only walks with his people, but also within them, in the sense that he identifies himself with men and women on their journey through history, particularly with the least, the poor and the marginalized. In this we see an extention of the mystery of the incarnation.

As a pilgrim church we are called to identify with the weakest and marginalized. We are reminded of our Lord's words, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head" (Matthew 8:20). We too recognize that our true home is in heaven, and as such we know that God not only wals with us, but He also identifies with us, with our humanity - the Word became flesh (Jn. 1:14). The Incarnate Word identifies with the weakes in our society which included the migrant and refugee - "I was a strangerm and you welcomed me...just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, vou did it to me" (Matthew 25:31-49).
