



We all know about this generosity - a woman giving everything she had to the donation box. I suspect that many parishes will be utilizing this story to highlight responsible financial giving. But the story is much more than that. It is also about poverty and how it can be a source of power and glory. Poverty is not always a problem. After all, Jesus himself embraced poverty. He waas born poor, he lived poor, and died poor. Poverty can teach us very important truths to live by.

The woman in our story was dressed simply. She did not enjoy the best seat in the house. She probably did not even appear holy. And the gospel tells us: "She out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on."

If we want to live good Christian lives, we need to learn to let go. To let go of comparison, competition, eexpectation, judgment, of appearances, of wanting to control, of excessive desire for approval and perfectionism.

Life is fragile. There are no guarantees. We can hope, but there are no ready answers. We can have faith, but there is no security. At the most, we can love. Love endures. Only love can carry us forward - to God, who is LOVE
