One of the practical messages in today's gospel is this: If you are going to pick up a fight or enter a context, you better know your opponent's strengths. Paul was smart to realize this. He had chosen to persecute the new religion, embodied in the person of Jesus Christ. But once he knew him, he did a 180-degree turn. In today's reading, Paul "considers everything as loss, because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus.

But the Pharisees, intelligent and educated, never did catch on to the fact they were no match for Jesus. The day before this incident, they had sent guards to arrest Jesus. The guards were so overwhelmed by the power of his message and the majesty of his presence, they returned to the Temple without him. To the enraged Pharisees all they could say say was: "No one ever spoke the way this man does?"

Instead of learning from this, the Pharisees immediately started looking for other ways to vanquish Jesus. They didn't have long to wait, for the very next day they set a trap they thought was foolproof.

Picture in your mind as described to us in the gospel story - Jesus knew exactly the right balance between justice and mercy - something most of us have a hard time achieving. After he had finished writing whatever it was he wrote, he stood up, looked directly at the crowd, and extended the invitation: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.
