This is the start of John's report of the great final teaching of Jesus at the Last Supper about the future of his Church and his disciples. From the sayings of Jesus, the Gospel writer has composed a great discourse of Jesus about the obligations, duties, and dangers whcih will come upon his disciples after his own death and resurrection.

As we approach the Birth of the Church at Pentecost we need to listen to how Jesus envisaged his community. This reading gives the essentials. At the head of the Christian community stands the glorified Son of Man, in whom God is glorified. But he will not be a figurehead. He will be present always. And how? In the love which his disciples show for one another.

I cannot help but appropriate these words of Jesus as I addressed you these days as your pastor. I have barely a month to go before I entrust this community to someone who will continue to shepherd you in the years ahead. My seventeen years with you were a blessing to me as I hope I am also to you. Our journey started small, celebrating our Masses in a school cafeteria for nine years, until we were able to build our own place of worship. Since our church was dedicated until now, we continue to grow. We have had our own share of struggles and difficulties, but we persevered.

As your founding pastor, I use the words of Jesus and urge you "to love one another...everyone will know that you are my disciples when you have love in your hearts."
