My time with you has reached its conclusion. Our adventure commenced nineteen years back when I was first introduced to the concept of creating a new parish in northwest Mississauga. However, it took an additional two years for the endeavor to truly take flight. Though nineteen years may seem lengthy, it feels as though it was just yesterday. I can't help but reminisce about the thrill of those moments—the encouragement from the Regional Bishop, the christening of the parish, the adventure of tracing the path of the saint we were named after, the encounter with the Canossian Daughters of Charity, the backing of the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board, the warm invitation from our mother parishes: St. John of the Cross and Merciful Redeemer, and the first families who embraced the call to nurture a vibrant Catholic community. I am profoundly thankful for the support extended by the members of my previous parish in Don Mills. To Ronnie, who shared his musical talent, to the Knights of Columbus for gifting us the wooden cross for our crucifix, and to the Daughters of Isabella for their efforts in organizing our women's group, and to Linda, who look after the house and made the Rectory a welcome place for everyone to gather. Then came the choir groups of Susie and Jamie, and Deacon Barry and Sheila, Cora & Boyer, Wai & Boy, Cora and Pol. At first, we thought only of offering one Mass at the School Cafeteria, but Deacon Barry had the foresight that we will be full house starting on day one. That first Sunday (the second week of July 2008), we started with four Masses. Shortly thereafter, Sister Cristina, JC and the whole community of St. Peter's joined us and a 7:30 AM Sunday was started. JC and his team diligently managed St. Peter's Church. Boyer and Cora stepped up to oversee the preparations at St. Joan of Arc School Cafeteria for our worship gatherings. For nine years, we came together in prayer. On two occasions, we sought temporary shelter at St. Faustina School and another Catholic institution due to severe weather. New leaders began to rise among you, leading to the establishment of various ministries and programs. Deacon Barry and Sheila responded to a divine invitation to serve in Regina, and in this journey, God blessed us with Deacon Roman and Agnes, Deacon Michael and Isabel, as well as Deacon Gerry and Betty. Additionally, Sister Nocy, Sister Linda, Msgr. Terence, Fr. Idara, Fr. Emmanuel, and many others joined us. Fatima was our first secretary and then Cecilia. Daniel, Clifford, and Ben, Nathan, Shawn, and Marina too.

After nine years filled with hope and aspiration, our church building was finally realized and received a heartfelt blessing from Thomas Cardinal Collins D.D. We cherished the beauty of our church for about a year. Thanks to the efforts of Pete and AJ Alcantara, who fine-tuned our camera and sound systems, we had a precious year to hone our skills in broadcasting our Masses. When the COVID-19 pandemic struck, we were among the first to rise to the occasion. While you participated in the Mass online, you did so in real time and later received Holy Communion. Fr. Jason paved the way for Fr. Peter and Fr. Michael, sons of St. Francis, to become part of our community. Throughout these years, we have felt God's presence. Our patron saint has served as our universal sister and beacon of hope. Many other saints have also graced us: Padre Pio, Therese of Lisieux, Bernadette Soubirous, Catherine Laboure, John Vianney, Margaret Alacoque, Pius X, and Anthony of the Desert. The journey continues with the Konkani Community and the Indonesian Community building community with us.

As I bid you farewell, beloved brothers and sisters, I hold a steadfast belief that God will bring to fruition the work that has begun. As you embrace your new pastor, Fr. Mark, consider him an extension of my presence. Seventeen years ago, you welcomed me into your lives; now, I urge you to open your hearts to him as well, and together, let us persist in our mission alongside our Blessed Mother of Charity at the foot of the Cross. Please keep me in your prayers as I embark on a new journey of compassion for those grieving the loss of a loved one. Although this path may be challenging, I trust that with God's grace, it will be as fruitful and fulfilling as my time with you.

I am truly grateful, and I vow to beseech the Almighty to shower you with blessings a thousand times for the generosity you have extended to me, a humble servant. To anyone I may have inadvertently hurt or troubled, I sincerely apologize. My actions stemmed not from ill intent, but from human frailty. I earnestly seek your compassion and forgiveness.
